

Questions to the Human Right Center (FAQ)



Q1. Who can use the Human Right Center?

Anyone can use the center as long as they are members who are under the statutes and regulations of Woosong University, including students, faculty, and staff.



Q2. When can I use the Human Right Center?

You can use the center when you have become aware of or witnessed cases of sexual harassment and assault or human right infringement, when you need human right or gender equality education, when you have difficulties or need knowledge in relation to sexuality or human rights, when you need advice and counsel on human right infringement and sexual assault and harassment damages, and when you want investigation and settlement of human right infringement and sexual harassment and assault cases.



Q3. Can I make a report even if I'm not the concerned party of the case?

Even if you are not the concerned party subjected to human right infringement, a person who knows this fact can also receive counseling or make a report. However, if the reporter is not the concerned party of the case, there may be limitations in investigation, and if the concerned party who has been victimized does not wish to report the case, its investigation and settlement may be ceased.



Q4. Can I make a report even if only one of the assaulter or victims is not affiliated with Woosong University?

Yes, you can. According to Article 2 (Scope of Application), Regulations of Woosong University Human Right Center, it is specified that "This is applicable even if only one party of the reportee or reporter is affiliated with our university."



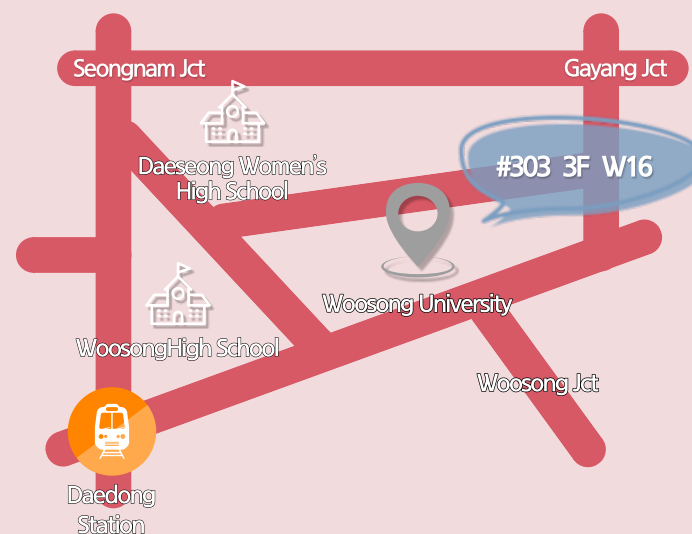
Q5. Can I receive counseling or make report anonymously?

Initial counseling can be received anonymously. However, your name must be indicated in the report when wishing a settlement of the case. Personal information of the counselee and the details of the counseling are not revealed externally, and confidentiality is ensured by principle.
